"Then by your logic, you should not have your clothes."


The guards took away the thief's clothes.

"What did the bear whisper in your ear?" he joked.


"He told me never to trust a selfish friend," the man replied.

The boy screamed, but no one believed him.


The wolf attacked, and he lost all his sheep.



The Rabbit and the Tortoise




- A rabbit was always boasting about being the fastest runner in the forest.
